TUN TAN CHENG LOCK SCHOLARSHIP IN HERITAGE STUDIES

Program

The scholarship was established in 2010 to support research in urban and architectural heritage in Southeast Asia. The scholarship is given to deserving students pursuing the Master of Arts in Architectural Conservation (MAArC) program offered by the Department of Architecture, NUS.

Scholarship

A maximum of 5 (five) scholarships will be awarded every year. Each scholarship will be a minimum of S\$3,000 (for a 6-month duration) or a maximum of S\$6,000 (for a 12-month duration). The Scholarship Selection Committee will determine the final award based on the period of the proposed research and fund availability.

The scholarship will be disbursed in two tranches:

- 50% at the commencement
- 50% at the time of final report submission

Eligibility

- 1. The applicant must be a student of the Master of Arts in Architectural Conservation (MAArC) program.
- 2. The applicant must have excellent academic performance.
- 3. The applicant must have a robust research proposal and an interest in heritage conservation issues prevalent in Southeast Asia.

Documents Required

- 1. Research Proposal (maximum 1,000 words), including Project Timeline and Budget
- 2. Academic Transcript for the MAArC program
- 3. Curriculum Vitae
- 4. Research/design portfolio related to heritage studies

Selection Criteria

- Only shortlisted applicants will be invited for an interview.
- Selection will be based on the quality of the research proposal and interview.
- The application can be submitted anytime between 1 November to 31 December (round 1) and 1 June to 31 July (round 2) each year.

Deliverables

- The scholarship recipient shall put up an exhibition at TTCLC in Melaka.
- Submit a written report (3,500-4,000 words) within two months of research completion.
