FAQs

PF1101 Fundamentals of Project Management

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1. Are there pre-requisites to read this course?

None. This course is meant to be foundational.

2. What is the unit for this course?

The course: PF1101 Fundamentals of Project Management consists of 4 units. The unit-value of a course is derived by dividing the estimated total number of workload hours per week for that course by the credit factor of 2.5 (i.e., one unit is equivalent to 2.5 hours of study and preparation per week).

Therefore, this 4-unit course would require 10 hours of work a week, including lectures, tutorials, projects, assignments, and preparatory work.

3. How is the schedule for this course?

Thirteen (13) lecture sessions will be held online on **every Thursday, 2pm to 4pm** via Zoom, starting in Week 1.

There are a total of five (5) tutorial sessions for the semester and they are held on alternate weeks. Tutorials commence in Week 3 (odd week) and Week 4 (even week) depending on which class you are in. For example, Tut [1] is held on odd week of Monday while Tut [2] is held on even week of Monday. Look up NUS Academic Calendar to check the dates for the respective weeks.

Tutorial classes are classroom-based, and **attendance is compulsory**. You can view and schedule your timetable at <u>NUSMods</u>.

6. How is the PF1101 course graded?

The assessment components for this course include:

- Group Report on Project Plans (50%)
- Individual Reflections Essay (25%)
- Tutorial Participation (10%)
- Discussion Contributions (10%)
- Quizzes (5%)

7. May I discuss with my friends to complete the quiz?

The quizzes are meant to check your understanding of the weekly lectures. You need the time to think and digest what you have learnt. So please set aside ample time to read the relevant lecture power-point slides, explanatory figures as well as study notes, and complete the relevant quiz for each of the 13 topics, so that you can learn effectively.

8. How many times can I attempt the quiz?

Students have two chances to complete the quizzes, with the best results taken for the Assessment.

9. When is the deadline for the completion of the quiz?

All quizzes must be completed by **Friday of Week 13 at 5.00pm.** However, it is recommended for students to follow the activities listed in the **Course Home Page** and complete the weekly quiz by the end of each week.

10. Am I allowed to exercise the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) option for this course?

Yes. Most courses within the common curriculum will be eligible for students to exercise the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) option, if they are foundational and carry no course prerequisites. For more information on S/U matters, please visit the <u>Student Portal S/U Home</u> Page.

Please note that the S/U option is <u>not</u> allowed for those reading PF1101 to meet the requirements for <u>Minor in Project Management</u>.

11. If I fail this course, can I retake?

Yes. Students could retake this course if they obtained 'F' grade or 'U' grade (if they exercise the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) option).

12. Is it compulsory for College of Design and Engineering (CDE) students to read PF1101 to fulfil the Project Management pillar in the Common Curriculum?

It is compulsory for CDE students (Cohort AY2021/2022 onwards) to read PF1101 Fundamentals of Project Management to fulfil the Project Management pillar in the Common Curriculum.

Note: Polytechnic diploma holders may be granted Advanced Placement Credits (APC) or exemption for this course PF1101. Please refer to this <u>website</u> for more information on course exemptions.

13. When must I read PF1101 course?

CDE students are required to select PF1101 based on the recommended timetable for their undergraduate curriculum provided by their respective home departments. For instance, some departments may arrange their Polytechnic direct entry students to read PF1101 in a semester that is different from the A-level students.

14. Where can I find the timetable from my department?

Note: Some departments may arrange their Polytechnic direct entry students to read PF1101 in a semester that is different from the A-level students.

15. I am from another faculty and am interested to read PF1101 as an Unrestricted Elective. But I am unable to select the course.

PF1101 is not offered as an Unrestricted Elective. Therefore, you are unable to select this course from the Course Registration System (<u>CourseReg@EduRec</u>).

You can consider doing a <u>Minor programme</u> and read PF1101 to meet the requirements for <u>Minor in Project Management or Minor in Infrastructure Management and Finance</u>.

The <u>Minor in Project Management</u> (restricted minor) is open to all NUS undergraduates in level 2 and 3 of a 4-year programme, except BEng (Infrastructure and Project Management), while the <u>Minor in Infrastructure Management and Finance</u> (open minor) is open to all students in NUS.

Undergraduate students (Cohort AY2022/2023 onwards) who are pursuing either the Bachelor of Computing programme or the Bachelor of Science (Business Analytics) programme may read PF1101 under Interdisciplinary (ID) Courses and select it in CourseReg@EduRec from Round 2 onwards.

College of Humanities and Sciences (CHS) undergraduate students (Cohort AY2021/2022 onwards) who are pursuing a <u>Double Degree Programme (DDP)</u> must read gateway course, PF1101 under CDE major (Infrastructure & Project Management). Students in this DDP whose CHS major is a Cross-Disciplinary Programmes (XDP) must read PF1101. You may submit an appeal to read PF1101 via <u>CourseReg@EduRec</u> from Round 2 onwards.

16. I tried to select the course PF1101 because I am keen to do a Minor in Project Management/Minor in Infrastructure Management and Finance. However, the course is not found in the CourseReg.

For students who are interested to do a <u>Minor in Project Management</u> (restricted minor), you must submit an online application within the application period via the **Academic Plan Application/Declaration (APAD)** function in EduRec.



Then, you will be able to select PF1101 from the Course Registration System (CourseReg@EduRec) from Round 2 onwards.

- 3. Sign in with your NUS ID and password




4. You have now signed in (activated for new NUS student) into your NUS-SG Zoom account.


- 5. Download and install Zoom for: Win | Mac

8. Click **Sign In with SSO** button. *Do not use the default sign in on the left.*




9. Click I know the company domain
